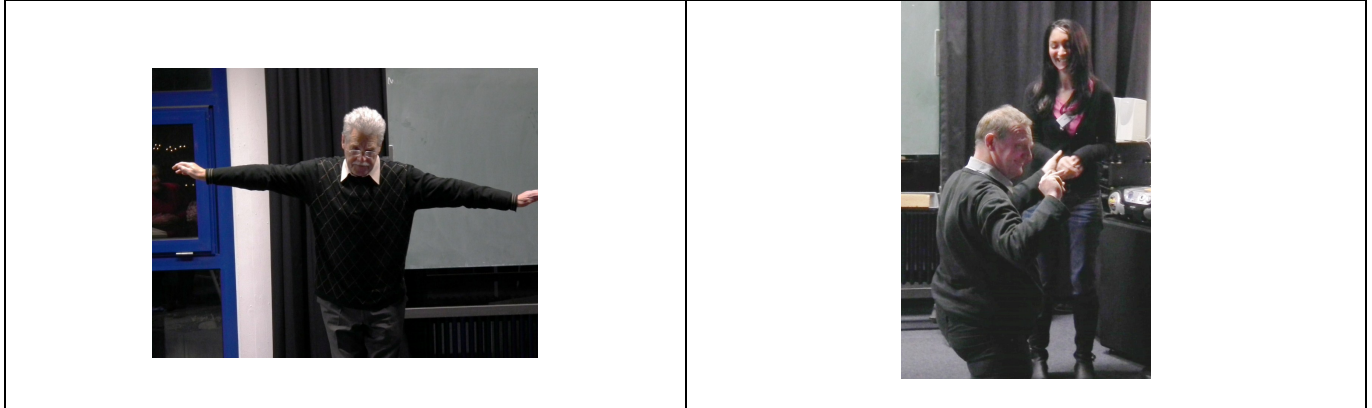




Project Title: Culture and Art: Bridges to Solidarity (CABS)

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Mime the Story

A story written by the teacher is cut into single sentences. The sentences are mixed and distributed to participants/Learners. They should keep their sentence hidden from the others. The teacher calls a name and the person mimes the sentence written on her/his card. The other learners have to guess the meaning of the sentence. All participants mime their sentence(s). When all have mimed their sentence and when they have been guessed correctly, the mimes should try to rebuilt the complete story and to do that they should stand in a row according to the realistic course of the story. To finish all participants standing in the row mime their part again in the chronological order of the story.

Example for a story to be mimed:

Fall down the staircase when running for the tube	Help the person to get up again	Make a date for a dinner	Eat together and start flirting
Ask for the hand of a girl/got engaged	Get married	Fly to your honeymoon place	Go to the beach for a swim
Discover you are pregnant/ your wife is pregnant	Show that you have a ravenous appetite on bananas	Call an ambulance because your baby is just going to be born	Cry like a baby!
Feed the baby!	Go for a walk with the baby buggy!	Make the baby's first steps!	Say the baby's first words!
